Throughout the pandemic we have maintained our connection with our existing sites who are eager for our return, and have cultivated new partnerships to expand our efforts. In response to this, we will be ramping up our recruitment for 2021-2022 to ensure that we have the number of teams required to fulfill these requests.

Community engagement remains a priority, and we have recently launched new outreach initiatives including the Paw-Pal Program to support children's literacy. Established in collaboration with local school boards across the National Capital Region, children at the elementary level have an opportunity to write to one of our Ottawa Therapy Dogs to enhance their writing skills. We have received an overwhelmingly positive response, which is just one example of the meaningful impact we can make when we diversify our programs.

While we look back on 2019 & 2020, we are grateful for the successes that we have achieved thanks to our donors, volunteers and partners. The level of support we have received inspires us as we look ahead to 2021 and the future growth of Ottawa Therapy Dogs.

EXECUTION AND IMPLEMENTATION OF THE STRATEGIC INTEGRATED PLAN

Ottawa Therapy Dogs (OTD) has a core mission to serve people of all ages who are coping with physical and mental health challenges. To both sustain and expand this mission across the National Capital Region, OTD employs three Key Result (KR) areas in line with our Strategic Plan that prioritizes our diverse programming and initiatives.

Define and concentrate on key areas for animalassisted interventions to increase our impact.

- As a generous supporter of OTD's programs, Cedarview Animal Hospital recruited three talented writers back in 2018—Judy Beltzner, Julianne Labreche and Karen Luker—to write a series of compelling stories about the work of OTD that continued through 2019 to show the impact of our programs to our broader community;
- Our in-person visits were suspended in March 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Our resilient volunteer teams continue to provide support through "The Zoomies" - virtual visits to seniors, children and hospital patients - until we can resume in-person visits;
- The impact of our virtual visits is also being felt by a number of frontline workers in our partner facilities who have the opportunity to join the virtual session for a dose of 'pawsitive support';
- In 2020, we launched an educational series, How do Puppies Grow?, in collaboration with OTD member, Ann Lambert. These videos were recorded in collaboration with a local school to support the Primary Science curriculum and serve as a valuable learning resource on animal growth and development
- Prior to the pandemic, we continued to cultivate local partnerships by taking part in special events as part of the Government of Canada's Workplace Charitable Campaign including visits with Natural Resources Canada and Health Canada;

- During the high school exam period, we visited Sacred Heart High School, Immaculata High School, St. Mother Teresa High School, and Ottawa Public Library's Sunnyside branch;
- In a time of urgent need, we visited John McRae Secondary School to provide support to students;
- Continued our ongoing partnership with Hydro Ottawa to offer special sessions with our R.E.A.D. teams for children at the Ottawa Public Library's Centennial Branch, and hosted an OTD dog wash in collaboration with Hydro Ottawa volunteers at Pet Valu Beechwood;
- Hosted a visit with 30 students at Crystal Bay Special Education Centre;
- Participated in a number of community events with local organizations including; CHEO's annual Teddy Bear Picnic, Family Fun Day as part of the Navigator Program at CHEO for families of children with medical complexities, Exam Cram at Sunnyside Public Library, Manor Park Community Summer Day Camps, and 'Reading Short Stories with Therapy Dogs' at the Multiple Sclerosis Society of Canada

Improve the effectiveness and reduce wait times of recruitment, training & evaluation processes.

- Launched our On-Demand Information Session video to streamline information on commitments and requirements to those interested in becoming an OTD team;
- Consulted with our Standards & Practices Committee to develop an assessment to determine the readiness of our OTD to return to in-person visits;
- In 2019, 20 new teams successfully completed an evaluation and mentoring and have been placed at one of our partner facilities;

- Held 7 evaluations, 3 information sessions and 2 orientations in 2019;
- The transition to full-time hours for Lorraine Douglas has allowed for quicker response times to help advance the onboarding of new OTD teams

Develop financial and human resources to build capacity through focused programs & processes.

- Promoted Lorraine Douglas from Program Manager to Operations Manager to reflect her role in expanding community partnerships, liaising with donors and members, executing new outreach/ recruitment programs and providing overall support to the organization;
- Hired John Bouza in January of 2020 for a oneyear term position in the role as Director of Development to provide expertise on advancing our fundraising efforts;
- Hired Jenna Hobin as a part-time Communications
 Consultant in 2020 to develop and execute a
 communications strategy that aligns with our
 strategic plan;
- Expanded our Board of Directors team to provide multi-faceted support in areas such as financial assessments, communications support, by-law development and strategic planning;
- Launched the Best Friends initiative in 2020 to encourage consecutive giving through a monthly contribution to go towards sponsoring an OTD's team of the donor's choice
- Launched a fundraising challenge in 2020 in partnership with Access Storage, who offered to match the first \$3000 in donations to OTD dollarfor-dollar. Our generous donors helped to exceed this goal, raising over \$6000 in support of our virtual visits;

- Continued our partnership with John Fluevog shoes through a community event that provided 50% of sales from the evening to OTD. They also helped us raise funds through our 'Fluevogs for Therapy Dogs 2019' raffle for a free pair of shoes;
- Participated in a Giving Tuesday challenge in 2019 in collaboration with Canada Helps who provided an extra \$5 in funding for each donation of \$25 or more made to OTD

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Despite the ongoing challenges with the global COVID-19 pandemic, OTD remains dedicated to providing support through virtual visits and a bi-weekly Instagram Live session accessible to the general public. With the health and safety of our volunteer teams as our top priority, we will continue to closely monitor the guidelines of Ottawa Public Health and the Government of Ontario to determine when in-person visits may resume. In the interim, we have focused on maintaining and cultivating new partnerships with local sites to ensure we are prepared once we are permitted to continue our visits in the community.
